WELCOME TO **SLAPSTICK FESTIVAL 2016**

Bristol's 12th Silent and Classic Comedy Festival

Slapstick Festival - Bristol's unique festival combining the cream of contemporary comedy with the legends of film and television history – arrives at its 12th and biggest edition presenting 25 unique events and running, for the first time, over five days.

This January our Friday night gala is hosted by Infinite Monkey Cage's co-host and comedian Robin Ince and offers Chaplin's most personal and richest comedy THE KID (1921), accompanied by his own music, newly edited by Maestro Timothy Brock, who conducts the Bristol Ensemble.

Laurel & Hardy are seen in their best-loved sound feature WAY OUT WEST (1937) and Harold Lloyd and Buster Keaton join them as the subject of special western comedy tributes in our 'Way Out West' strand. Classic Hollywood comedy is also featured in special tributes to Mack Sennett, the rarely remembered Laura La Plante and the all but forgotten Ben Turpin whose acutely crossed eyes brought fame and fortune.

We also remember a rich byway of British cinema, Mancunian Productions, who captured on film a great generation of Northern comics including: Frank Randle, Norman Evans, George Formby and Jimmy Jewell, earning for themselves the nickname of Jollywood.

The North also produced the unique and unrivalled giant of British comedy Ken Dodd, whose sixty-oneyear career we are privileged to honour with this years' Aardman Slapstick Comedy Legend Award on Monday 25th January 2016, extending the festival by an extra day.

Stephen Merchant will be joining us for the first time to discuss his top comedy moments and of course the faithful regulars whose support and enthusiasm has been crucial to the survival and continuous development of the Bristol Slapstick 'family', most of them from television, return once more including The Goodies, Lucy Porter, Ian Lavender and the unstoppable Barry Cryer.

This year we remember some of television's great comedy successes of the past – Here Come The Double Deckers!, The 1948 Show, and the wonderful Phil Silvers as Sergeant Bilko - all bursting vividly back to life with an audience, without any need for the indulgence of nostalgia.

We should not say it ourselves, but it's a great festival and we know it exemplifies the dictum of Douglas Fairbanks (who is featured this year too) a century ago: "Happiness is for all who strive to be happy - and those who laugh are happy.

SLAPSTICK INTERNATIONAL: Bed and Sofa /Tretya Meshchanskaya (1927)

Originally billed as a satire and comedy, this film was controversial at the time of its release in the Soviet Union, due to its focus on human relationships and disregard of state and party. Banned also in both the United States and Europe due to its realistic portrayal of sexual relationships, 'Bed and Sofa' is now considered a landmark film due to the humour, naturalism and sympathetic portrayal of the female character within the film. Live piano accompaniment by John Sweeney.

A married couple have a small apartment in Moscow. When an old friend of the husband's arrives in the city and is unable to find lodgings, Kolia, the husband invites his friend to move in with them. This leads to interesting consequences for all three.

Jollywood! The Golden Age of Mancunian films

THURS 21 JAN 1615hrs Watershed £8.00/£6.00 With Mike Livesley (Sir Henry at Rawlinson End/Bonzo Dog-Doo-Dah Band)

A whistle-stop charabanc ride through the almost mythical world of Mancunian Film studio known affectionately as 'Jollywood'. In 1932 a meeting took place between film distributors James Blakeley, his son John E Blakeley and the inimitable Laurel and Hardy, during which Laurel persuaded them to venture into making talking pictures. Mancunian films was born. Their first film 'Boots! Boots!' starring George Formby followed in 1934 and they continued to make peculiarly northern comedies until 1953 with stars such as Frank Randle, Norman Evans, Sandy Powell and Jimmy Jewell. A fascinating insight into this 'golden age' of cinema.

Cary Grant: The Awful Truth (1937)

Bristol's legendary Cary Grant teams with screwball comedy's most underrated actress, Irene Dunne, in the film that broke him as a romantic lead. Named as the "slapstick prince charming" by critic Pauline Kael, for his marriage of elegance and physical comedy, Grant stars in the definitive, Oscar winning comedy of the 1930s. Leo McCarey, a veteran of Slapstick comedy (Sherlock Jr., Duck Soup), directs this vaudeville team. Introduced by stand-up comedian Lucy Porter. In Partnership with the Cary Grant Comes Home for the Weekend Festival.

Entangling her ever-loving husband in the process the film tells how and to what lengths she is willing to go to escape conviction.

Laura La Plante: Home James (1928)

David Robinson film critic, author and Chaplin's official biographer will be celebrating the mastermind of early slapstick comedy, the actor and producer, Mack Sennett. David will take you on a journey through his best comedy shorts from the 1910s and 1920's featuring amongst others Charlie Chaplin, himself and the hilarious Keystone cops . With live accompaniment by John Sweeney.

Anita Loos: Hollywood Pioneer

Lucy Porter talks about the fascinating life of Anita Loos - one of early Hollywood's most talented and prolific screenwriters. Her friends and collaborators included DW Griffith, the Talmadge sisters, Mary Pickford and Douglas Fairbanks. A troubled marriage to fellow writer John Emerson interrupted her stellar career but Anita remains a worldwide legend thanks to 'Gentlemen Prefer Blondes'. Lucy will introduce two early examples of her work: The New York Hat (1912, Dir: D.W. Griffith US 16mins) featuring Mary Pickford and The Mystery of the Leaping Fish (1916, Dir: Christy Cabanne and John Emerson USA 25mins) featuring Douglas Fairbanks and Bessie Love. With live harp accompaniment by Elizabeth - Jane Baldry.







Dir John Emerson US 72mins

Starring the King of Hollywood, Douglas Fairbanks, Wild and Woolly is one of the best action packed comedy Westerns of the silent era. Jeff is a rich Easterner who always wanted to live in the "Wild West". He finally gets the chance to move to a town out West, but unbeknown to him, the town's "wild" days are long over. The townspeople are all after Jeff for his money, so they humour his taste for the "West" and in true Fairbanks style the films plays out some of the best stunts and funniest moments on film. Introduced by Lobster Film's co-founder Serge Bromberg.

Chaplin's The Kid: The Inside Story With David Robinson

Chaplin authority David Robinson offers fresh insights on Chaplin's The Kid (1921) - presented later this evening with live performance of Chaplin's own musical score. One of the world's great comedies, at the same time achieving a pitch of emotion rarely paralleled in cinema, The Kid derives from Chaplin's own life experience, and proves his fundamental conviction that comedy and tragedy are separated only by the thinnest line. He also shows how six-year-old Jackie Coogan provided Chaplin with the perfect mimic, enabling him to realise his own internalised and autobiographical title character.

'At Last the 1948 Show' triggered a revolution that was destined to change the face of TV comedy forever. Bursting onto the nation's small screens in an explosion of unrelated and often surreal sketches, its main perpetrators were Tim Brooke-Taylor, John Cleese, Graham Chapman, Marty Feldman and Aimi MacDonald. What 'At Last the 1948 Show' began the Monty Python and The Goodies would finish in their own inimitable way. Four 'lost' episodes of At last the 1948 Show have recently been recovered from the David Frost Collection. Here we offer a rare opportunity to watch excerpts from the show's best bits and from some of the newly discovered editions followed by a Q&A as Tim and Aimi discuss this seminal comedy show on stage with presenter Chris Serle.
