



Music has been a key ingredient of every Slapstick since the festival began. But for our 19th annual edition, we're giving it extra special attention. As well as live accompaniments to all our silent films, we're celebrating some of the many marriages between comedy and music, including via classic mockumentaries, Beatles revelations and family-friendly movies filled with hit songs.

Alongside the musical comedy thread, there's another - eight event strand saluting the comic legacy of Sir Michael Palin & Monty Python's Flying Circus, including solo projects by and nods to the people they influenced. Sir Michael Palin our 2023 guest curator, (who will be 80 in May) will be joining us in person for 2 events, and introducing a selection of his favourite starring and non-starring films on video.

National treasure Sir Michael will not, of course, be our only special guest. Others in the live line-up include Rob Brydon, Graeme Garden, Harry Hill, Peter Lord, Alex Lovell, Griff Rhys Jones, Stephen Merchant, Nigel Planer, Lucy Porter, Peter Richardson, Paul Mcgann and all three members of The Scaffold.

As ever, much of the programme is dedicated to silent film comedy, its stars and innovators, with many of the films rare to see, recently rediscovered

&/or newly restored. With this, we are delighted to be welcoming some of the finest champions of cinema and comedy's history, among them the Oscar-winning Kevin Brownlow, Oliver Double, Polly Rose and Steve Massa/Ben Model.

Slapstick 2023 launches its festival-wide salute to comedy and music with a family-friendly screening of the fantasy adventure centred on a magical car. Taking inspiration from a novel by James Bond creator Ian Fleming, Chitty Chitty Bang Bang was co-scripted by Roald Dahl and features a dozen songs from the Oscar-winning Sherman Brothers and stars lifelong Charlie Chaplin, Stan Laurel and Buster Keaton fan Dick Van Dyke. As an added treat for ticket holders, a replica of the car, as seen on Strictly Come Dancing and the 50th Anniversary celebrations at Pinewood Studios, will be in Millennium Square for selfies from 12 midday on the 14th Feb.

It's not surprising Walt Disney considered this film the crowning achievement of his long career - it won his studio a record 13 Oscar nominations and five wins, including for best songs. It is also where Dame Julie Andrews makes her Hollywood debut, portraying the nanny with magical powers in a star-studded cast headed by Dick van Dyke. Whether you're seeing it for the first time or as a nostalgic reminder of your childhood, this is an event that will ensure it's a happy (half-term) holiday for all ages.

In stark contrast to most films made immediately after the Russian Revolution, this is an endearing rom-com filled with likeable characters and some self-effacing insights into the filmmaking process. At the centre of it all is cigarette seller Zina (played by the future Cannes award-winning director Yuliya Solntseva) and the love tangles that surround her when she is talent-spotted to become an actress. Fred Karno: The Legend Behind The Laughter

Without the wit, grit and creativity of Exeter-born Fred Karno, the Slapstick Festival itself might not exist. Karno was the acrobat, gag deviser and impresario who recruited and trained many of the physical performers who gave Hollywood its slapstick comedy stars, such as Charlie Chaplin, Stan Laurel and Will Hay. The festival is delighted, therefore, to host an illustrated conversation between Andrew Kelly (Bristol ideas) and David Crump - author of a definitive new biography of the man whose mantra "If in doubt, fall on your arse" influences so many of the entertainers Slapstick celebrates. The films, made between 1898 to 1926, feature slapstick high jinks, swipes at authority, gender swaps, feminist protests, and rebellions against the behaviour generally expected or demanded of women in those times. Included in the Slapstick 2023 line-up at the express request of guest curator Sir Michael Palin, who chose it as his favourite film comedy, Rob Reiner's 11 out of 10 deserving mockumentary is a scathing lampoon of every heavy metal band that's ever taken itself too seriously and of rock music documentaries in general. With a sequel reportedly on the way (with Reiner again in charge and Christopher Guest, Michael McKean and Harry Shearer reprising their characters), there's no better time to revel in this big-screen outing of a film hailed by Rotten Tomatoes critics as "Smartly directed, brilliantly acted, and packed with endlessly quotable moments... an all-time comedy classic."







Michael Palin, now a real knight, plays the most roles - 12 - and Sir Not-To-Be-Seen-In-This-Film is his then infant son, William. A cult comedy classic.

Slapstick's 80th birthday salute to comedy legend Sir Michael Palin continues with some of his personal favourite starring films. This big screen showing of an Alan Bennett scripted comedy is set in Yorkshire in 1947, when post-WW2 Britain was still experiencing strict meat rationing. Local bigwigs are planning a feast to celebrate the upcoming wedding of Princess Elizabeth and Prince Philip. Betty, a secretly-raised pig, is destined to be the meal's main course. But the plans go awry when Betty is stolen, inspiring deeds and dialogue reminiscent of an Ealing Comedy. A deserved winner

YOU'D BE SURPRISED, featuring intertitles by the humourist Robert Benchley of Algonquin Round Table fame. It provoked mixed reactions. A contemporary critic described it as "One of the very best or very worst comedies I ever saw" but when shown recently at Cinecon, Hollywood, it was judged the undisputed hit of the weekend.



The Scaffold - A Celebration with Harry Hill

There's never been a satirical performance group quite like The Scaffold. In the sixties and early seventies, their unique blend of comedy, music and poetry packed out theatres at home and across the world and their frequent appearances on prime-time TV ensured that John Gorman, Roger McGough and Mike "McGear" McCartney became much-loved household names.

Equally loved by the mainstream and 1960s counter-culture, they produced hit after hit of chart-topping perennial favourites, including Thank U Very Much (for the Aintree Iron), Lily the Pink & Liverpool Lou.
