



Opening Slapstick's 20th anniversary, Aardman's Peter Lord CBE chats with Andrew Smith, director of Cartoon Carnival; a lovingly-researched documentary telling the story of the early days of animated film and of one man's quest to rescue pre-sound cartoons from obscurity and share them with new audiences. We will be showing the film in full, which includes contributions from Kevin Brownlow, Walt Disney, Peter Lord himself and Tommy Jose Stathes, among many others.

South West Silents' Peter Walsh introduces this gentle and graceful comedy about women trying to navigate a male dominated world. With live piano accompaniment from Daan van den Hurk. Regularly undermined by work colleagues and clients until he's hypnotised into believing he is a lion. Host Andrew Kelly will be talking live via Zoom to Dr. Harriet Fields, granddaughter of W.C. Fields. With live piano accompaniment from Daan van den Hurk.


HAROLD LLOYD IN THE FRESHMAN

Actor and Lloyd superfan Paul McGann welcomes you to Bristol's largest screen for a screening of one of Harold Lloyd's best-loved comedies. Satirising college life, Lloyd is a student desperate to gain popularity, including on the football field, despite having no flair for the game. As his classmates fake friendship and aim to make him look like a fool, will the affection of his landlady's daughter be enough to turn his fortunes around? Accompanied by Carl Davis' critically acclaimed score, this is a heartwarming and hilarious event you won't want to miss.



Stand-up star Lucy Porter introduces two films linked by their takes on marriage. LE TORCHON BRULE, by far the oldest and shortest in this year's programme, stars Sarah Duhamel as one half of a couple engaged in all-out war.

The main feature, OH! WHAT A NURSE!, has Charlie Chaplin's brother Syd, seeking to prevent a young heiress from marrying her uncle's dubious choice of suitor, with madcap results. Includes a bit part for future double Oscar winner Janet Gaynor. With live piano accompaniment by Daan van den Hurk.

KEATON: THE SAPHEAD

In Buster Keaton's feature film debut, THE SAPHEAD, directed by the husband of groundbreaking filmmaker Alice Guy. Keaton plays Bertie, the son of a silver mine owner who's shady brother-in-law ruins Bertie's wedding plans with lies and jeopardises the family's wealth. Host Polly Rose says "this could be described as a dramedy; there are dark moments but also a grand slapstick action sequence at the height of the story". Watch out also for a rare smile from Buster; there isn't another by him on screen until 1934.

KEATON: A DOUBLE HELPING

Buster Keaton's granddaughter Melissa
Talmadge Cox joins Keaton scholar Polly Rose
in conservation via video link from California,
to introduce Old Stone Face's final silent, the
Berlin Festival award-winning, THE RAILRODDER
(Dir: Gerald Potterton, Canada, 1965, 24 mins),
released four months before Buster's death.
Featuring Buster taking a gag-packed solo rail
trip across Canada in an open-top "speeder" in
vibrant colour.

Accompanying this is John Spotton's Venice Festival award-winning documentary on the film's production, BUSTER KEATON RIDES AGAIN (Canada, 1965, 55mins), with unseen gems including the crew's efforts to dissuade the 69-year-old Keaton from doing a highly risky stunt (ignored!).

THE GREAT DICTATOR (1940)

In this special big screen outing of Chaplin's poignant satire, Alasdair and Robin will explore how Chaplin skillfully used comedy to take aim at authoritarianism, racism and war. The Great Dictator was Chaplin's first talking picture, and he didn't hold back. His brilliant lampooning of Adolf Hitler made the film both an act of defiance and a masterclass in weaponising humour. Despite being banned in Nazi-occupied territories and doubts about its success elsewhere the film became Chaplin's highest grossing film. The film's closing speech remains one of cinema's most daring and timeless works.

Starting today's line-up of Soviet Union satires, Slapstick favourite Lucy Porter introduces a screwball romcom directed by Boris Barnet, the master of Soviet silent cinema.

It stars the Ukrainian/ Swedish beauty, Anna Sten later whisked to Hollywood by Sam Goldwyn who dubbed her 'the new Greta Garbo'. Sten plays a hat maker caught in a love triangle and the challenges involving a room rental scam plus the winning of a lottery ticket. With live piano accompaniment by Günter A. Buchwald.

SOVIET COMEDIES OF THE 1920s + CHESS FEVER

Film historian and Silent London blogger Pamela Hutchinson offers context for our Soviet comedies day with a presentation highlighting the influence of 1920s Soviet silent comedies + Chess Fever (1925). Shot in Moscow with real footage from the World Chess Championships, the film follows a young woman (Anna Zemtsova) frustrated by her fiancé's chess obsession. Trying to escape, she meets World Chess Champion José Raúl Capablanca. This blending of fiction and reality formed a lasting impact on cinema, influencing future sports comedies and the use of real-world figures in films.

THE OPPORTUNIST

Recently rediscovered and restored in Ukraine, this rare find from the co-director of Chess Fever (1925) is a satire about a small-time racketeer trying to turn Bolshevism to his advantage. Ending up with the Red Army, in charge of a camel, this film was banned by Soviet apparatchiks for its political commentary. Introduced by actor Paul McGann, with live piano accompaniment by John Sweeney. All profits from this event will be donated to Ukrainian Charity 'From Bristol With Love'.

THE HOUSE AT TRUBNAYA SQUARE

A widely regarded masterpiece of Soviet silent cinema, this delightful comedy of manners satirises life in Moscow during a time of evershifting, often contradictory, policies. Starring Vera Maretskaya, a five times winner of the Stalin Prize for acting, as a country girl seeking her uncle in the big city and finding herself in a highly eccentric household. Noted for comic timing, clever use of editing, innovative camera angles and the involvement of five scriptwriters, all of them literary or political notables. Introduced by Pamela Hutchinson with live piano accompaniment by John Sweeney.

SMASHING MELONS! ROBIN INCE & MARK MIODOWNIK


I WAS BORN. BUT

This star-studded panel will explore whether satirical comedy still holds relevance in our chaotic modern world or if it has lost its edge in the face of 21st-century politics.





However, his career as a scriptwriter began in 1980 leading to writing credits and cameo roles in a wide array of TV comedy classics, among them The Young Ones, the showbiz spoof Filthy Rich & Catflap, some of the Blackadder series and Upstart Crow, and to collaborations with stars such as French & Saunders, Rik Mayall, Ade Edmondson, Emma Thompson, Stephen Fry and Rowan Atkinson.

Along the way, he has written over a dozen novels and worked on musicals, including Andrew Lloyd Webber's The Beautiful Game, and the hit jukebox musical built around Queen songs, We Will Rock You. With onscreen extracts, Ben will be talking with Last Leg presenter and comedian, Adam Hills, about highlights of his career prior to receiving a personalised Morph, conferring on him Aardman Slapstick Comedy Legend status. "What an amazing honour to be joining such an incredible pantheon of Aardman/Slapstick Legends! I would have liked to have pulled off a perfect pratt fall to celebrate but at 65 I'm worried I'd do my back in.
